



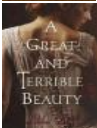
# AIS-R Summer Reading -- Grade 10



**Alvarez, Julia: *In the Time of the Butterflies*** c1994 historical fiction A fictionalized account of four Mirabel sisters who helped form a resistance movement in the Dominican Republic against the dictatorship of General Trujillo.



**Anderson, MT *Feed*** c2002 science fiction, war People in this futuristic society constantly receive information and commercials from computers implanted in their brains at birth. The story criticizes our consumer-driven society.



**Bray, Libba: *A Great and Terrible Beauty*** c2004 historical fantasy Gothic with a touch of the occult and light horror, Bray creates an adolescent heroine with present day sensibilities. The novel also provides a strong depiction of the role of women in Victorian times.



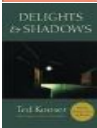
**Cary, Kate: *Bloodline: A Novel*** c2005 historical fiction A British soldier in World War I finds out that his regiment commander is a descendant of Count Dracula.



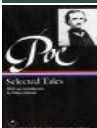
**Pearson, Mary : *The Adoration of Jenna Fox*** c2008 science fiction In the not-too-distant future, when biotechnological advances have made synthetic bodies and brains possible but illegal, a seventeen-year-old girl, recovering from a serious accident and suffering from memory lapses, learns a startling secret about her existence.



**Haddon, Mark: *The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time*** c2003 mystery Christopher, a mathematically-gifted but socially challenged autistic teen, uncovers secrets about his own family while investigating the murder of a neighbor's dog.



**Kooser, Ted: *Delights and Shadows*** c2004 poetry Presents a collection of poems by Poet Laureate, Ted Kooser, that describe the habits and struggles of daily life.



**Poe, Edgar Allen: *Selected Tales*** c2001 classic, horror Seventeen of Edgar Allan Poe's short stories including "The Tell-Tale Heart."



**Satrapi, Marjane: *Persepolis: The Story of a Childhood*** c2003 biography, graphic novel Graphic novel depicting how the author lived in Tehran, Iran until the country came under the control of the Islamic regime.



**Shelley, Mary: *Frankenstein*** horror, classic Victor Frankenstein discovers the secret of generating life and creates a monster.



**Spiegelman, Art: *Maus: A Survivor's Tale I and II*** historical fiction, graphic novel A memoir about Vladek Spiegelman, a Jewish survivor of Auschwitz and his son, a cartoonist, who tries to come to terms with his father and history itself. The cartoon format portrays Jews as mice and Nazis as cats.



**Volponi, Paul: *Black and White*** c2005 realistic fiction Two friends experience the justice system differently after committing a crime and getting caught.



**Zusak, Markus : *The Book Thief*** c2006 historical fiction Trying to make sense of the horrors of World War II, Death relates the story of Liesel--a young German girl whose book-stealing and story-telling talents help sustain her family and the Jewish man they are hiding, as well as their neighbors.



**Hosseini, Khaled: *A Thousand Splendid Suns*** c2007 fiction Afghan women Mariam and Laila grow close, despite their nearly twenty-year age difference and initial rivalry, as they suffer at the hands of a common enemy--their abusive, much-older husband, Rasheed.
